

## DDTC Measures During COVID-19 Pandemic

MARCH 23, 2020

On March 18, the U.S. State Department's Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC) posted this [notice](#) on its site to inform industry and the public of the measures it is taking to continue service during the current COVID-19 pandemic. DDTC will continue to operate its Licensing, Compliance, Policy, and Management functions with adjustments in accordance with the U.S. Office of Personnel Management's (OPM) [guidance](#) along with other agency's guidance. Licensing, Commodity Jurisdiction, and General Correspondence will continue to operate with delays. Enrollment and registration requests are still operating via the [DECCS system](#) and are being reviewed on a rolling basis. The DDTC has also established a new option to submit disclosures and related information pursuant to ITAR Section 127.12 via email to [DTCC-CaseStatus@state.gov](mailto:DTCC-CaseStatus@state.gov). The Help Desk and Response Team are still running, and the website will continue to provide status updates going forward.
