- Gathering evidence varies significantly across legal systems. Companies must tailor their approach to align with the specific jurisdiction’s legal framework while ensuring compliance with overarching anti-bribery principles.
- A multi-ended approach is critical to demonstrate not just adherence to local requirements but also a structured compliance journey that shows proactive risk management.
- While U.S. compliance standards often set the benchmark, aligning global policies to meet or exceed those standards is a practical strategy. That said, there is often a large overlap across jurisdictions, making it crucial to map requirements and identify gaps to ensure national-level compliance.
- Compliance is not just a legal function—it requires engagement from audit, legal, and finance teams to build a cohesive compliance structure. A well-coordinated internal approach ensures consistency when presenting to regulators

Global anti-bribery enforcement is only growing in complexity. A structured, risk-based compliance framework that integrates multi-jurisdictional obligations while maintaining practical enforceability is crucial.
